Overview

Description of the Big Idea/Topic to be explored in this lesson:

Write one paragraph that describes the big idea and how the lesson relates to that big idea.

Students will be working on pieces that have already been started by other students. This will require them to think about how they can visually connect to a drawing they did not start. It has students view lines and shapes in ways they may not have before to make connections and create a cohesive piece.

By giving students a chance to work off of their peer's work, they are encouraged to think outside of the box and alongside their peers. They will be encouraged to think about how their additions to the work can positively affect the overall outcome and to think about how to use someone else's work as a jumping-off point. Students may choose to continue the work in the same direction as the original artist, or to take the piece in an entirely new direction.

Relevance for Learners:

How and why is this lesson relevant for the learners?

Collaboration and teamwork are important skills in all aspects of life. By giving the students limited time to react and create based on their peer's previous drawings, students will gain new problem-solving skills. Having work to show that all the students worked on together is a great way to foster a sense of inclusion and community within the classroom.
